

SUMMER 2020 ONLINE COURSE AGREEMENT

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS FOR SUMMER ONLINE LEARNING

Expectations for all Ursuline students participating in Summer Programs delivered in an online format will be shared by each teacher on the first class day. Students should read and follow these best practices to be successful in their course or workshop.

SUMMER SCHOOL ONLINE CREDIT CLASSES

These accelerated courses offer a .5 credit (one semester) course in 15 days. Each class day is the equivalent of one week in a semester course. By enrolling in a Summer School online credit class, the student is agreeing to:

- maintain consistent, proactive online communication with their teachers,
- attend and participate in all online class sessions, and
- complete all independent work on a daily basis, as assigned.

If a student is challenged by consistent online attendance, managing independent work or has difficulty completing assignments on time in a fast-paced setting, this program may not be a good fit.

Grades

Summer credit classes follow the grading policies stated in the Student Handbook and in each course's class policies. Summer course credits and grades will be applied to the following semester's transcript. Seniors with a grade of 90 or above are exempt from final exams. Other types of final assessments are not eligible for exemption.

Attendance

All online classes have **daily** synchronous online class meetings and independent work time. **Attendance is taken** at the beginning of each class meeting. Late arrivals to and early departures from class meetings count as a .5 absence. Due to the abbreviated schedule, absences are limited to 2 per credit course. **Any combination of missed class time totaling over 2 absences will result in a loss of credit for the class.**

SUMMER SCHOOL ONLINE WORKSHOPS

These short, non-credit courses prepare students for a successful school year. They do not offer course credit and do not appear on the student's transcript. Daily attendance and participation in class sessions and completion of independent work is expected. Grades, if applicable, will follow the individual workshop's grading policy.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

All aspects of the Ursuline Code of Conduct will be enforced for students' online behavior in and related to their online course. Infractions given during the summer term will be applied to the following semester.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Online courses are subject to the Ursuline Honor Code. Breaches of honor, including cheating and plagiarism, will be referred to the Dean of Students. Students are advised to be cautious of academic shortcuts available online.
