Typical Sample Schedule

- There are a total of 8.0 credits divided among two school days (known as A-day & B-day) during the regular school day (8:45 a.m. – 3:45 p.m.).
- Courses rotate every other day.
- All students are required to take a minimum of 7.0 credits per year.

Typical Sample Schedule

- Typical Schedule for Freshman:
 - 7 Credits with a fall and spring study period
 - English 1 credit
 - Social Studies 1 credit
 - Theology 1 credit
 - World Language 1 credit
 - Math 1 credit
 - Science 1 credit
 - Wellness/Speech/Visual Arts/Performing Arts/Electives
 - Fall and Spring Study Period carry no credit

 - A student must take 3 consecutive years of their selected World Language beginning with Freshman year. Fourth year is optional.

 - Wellness 0.5 PE credit


